Louisiana delegates weigh in from Democratic National Convention

This is the second convention for Lake Charles native Davante Lewis, who says his favorite part is seeing the diversity.

"You see every face; you see every color, race, gender, creed, rich, poor, black, white, straight, Hispanic," said Lewis, "It is America in this room. It's an experience of a lifetime, to do it with so many people who look so different but are all so united."

Lewis said it's easy to get caught up in the race to the White House and lose sight of the people who'll be affected by this election. He said the convention has allowed delegates to share their stories with each other and put people back in focus.
